

SCGS DIRECT SCHOOL ADMISSION (DSA) EXERCISE 2025

(For Admission into Secondary 1 in Year 2026)

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A. DSA IN SCGS

Singapore Chinese Girls' School is a dual-track school offering:

- the 6-year Integrated Programme (IP) leading to GCE 'A' Level Certificate, in partnership with Eunoia Junior College (EJC), and
- the 4-year Secondary Education Certificate (SEC) Programme that leads to the Singapore-Cambridge Secondary Education Certificate.

Commitment upon Admission via DSA

Students who are successfully admitted to the school via DSA are required to honour their commitment to the school and programme (4 years for the Singapore-Cambridge Secondary Education Certificate Programme or 6 years for the Integrated Programme) and participate in the activities related to the talent they are selected for from year 1-4.

The IP is a six-year programme. Students are expected to fulfil their commitment to the school for the full duration, and transfers to other schools are strongly discouraged. In particular, transfers to other IP schools are not allowed, unless under exceptional circumstances.

Making your DSA Choices

Parents and students are encouraged to choose schools wisely based on the student's aptitudes and strengths, bearing in mind the schools' academic and non-academic requirements, and the programmes available to develop the area of talent.

Number of Choices:

Students can indicate up to three choices (maximum of two choices for the same school under two different talent areas).

SCGS Dual-track Options:

When applying to SCGS for a talent area that is offered in both the Singapore Education Certificate (SEC) and Integrated Programme (IP), applicants must indicate their preference for (i) Secondary Education Certificate (SEC) Programme, (ii) Integrated Programme (IP), or (iii) No Preference (i.e. open to both tracks).

Exercising your Preference upon receiving offers

Students who receive offers through DSA should submit their preferred choice of schools online through the DSA-Sec Portal. Upon login, students will see the list of schools and offers available. Students may rank up to three schools in order of preference.

If a student is successfully admitted to a school through DSA-Sec, she will not be eligible to participate in Sec 1 Posting and will not be allowed to transfer to another school after the release of PSLE results.

If a student is not ready to commit to the DSA-Sec school, do not submit any school preference.

Scholarships & Financial Assistance

Financial considerations should not deter talented students from seeking admission to SCGS. Financial assistance schemes and awards are available to support eligible students. Students who are interested in an SCGS education and see opportunities for their talent development at SCGS are encouraged to apply. School fees should not be a barrier to DSA applications or acceptance of offers.

B. TIMELINE FOR TESTS, AUDITIONS AND TRIALS

Venue: SCGS	
Shortlisted applicants will be notified of the assigned date, time and venue through email.	July - August
To ensure a conducive environment for all applicants, parents/guardians will not be allowed to wait on our school premises.	
Students are selected based on merit. The school will not release the reasons for non-selection of applicants and/or the results of the audition, trial, written test and interview.	
Notification of Outcome	All applicants will receive their application outcomes between 25 Aug and 4 Sep 2025

Applicants who do not have prior experience may also apply. The school will assess applicants based on the selection criteria, which may include assessing the potential of the applicants.

Please note that meeting all the criteria does not guarantee the student will be shortlisted/given an offer.

Leadership	 In SCGS, we seek to develop servant leaders who are anchored in school values, have a heart for those they serve and sincerely render their skills and time to contribute to the greater good of the school and community. Students who enter the school through leadership DSA will serve the school and wider community through a variety of projects and outreach opportunities. These students will also attend training and workshops to develop their own leadership pathways. Outstanding students may be elected into the Prefectorial Board or as executive leaders in their CCAs. All potential nominees are subject to stringent criteria and an electoral process.

PERFORMING ARTS(PA) CRITERIA

How to submit your video recordings
All applications must be submitted through the official MOE DSA Online Portal.

All applicants are required to submit video recordings of your talent area. Incomplete applications will reduce the chance of being shortlisted for auditions.

1. VIDEO RECORDINGS

All video recordings should demonstrate the applicant's performance abilities.

Videos should be recorded in a single take, without editing, and must **not** be professionally produced.

For applicants using existing videos of past performances, please indicate the date of the performance.

When uploading the videos:

- a. Use any video uploading website (e.g. Google Drive or YouTube).
 - The date of the recording must be clearly visible.
- b. Ensure privacy settings are set to 'Public' or 'Anyone with the Link'.
 - If using any other video uploading platform, please ensure the date of the recording is included in the description.
 - If using Google Drive, the title of the video should follow this format: [Applicant's Name_DSA_CCA- Name_DDMMYYYY]. DDMMYYYY refers to the date of recording.

2. LINKS TO VIDEO RECORDINGS IN THE APPLICATION FORM

 Share the video link in the online application form for DSA at Step 3 under NON-SCHOOL BASED AWARDS/ ACTIVITIES (Year / Period / Award & Activity Description) in the MOE DSA-SEC Application Portal.

Applicants may perform something scripted, devised, or improvised, and can be something learnt in school (e.g. in class or CCA). Students preparing their own performance can search for scripts of fairy tale or folk tale adaptations online or create these themselves. 	 have strong potential, aptitude and passion in drama are creative and forthcoming in collaboration
Handbell Ensemble	 A two-to-four minute solo performance comprising, either: on handbells if available, OR on another available instrument (e.g. solo voice, piano, violin, guitar, etc.) Applicants may perform pieces learnt in school, extracts from school handbell repertoire, instrumental parts from a school concert piece, or music from previous examinations. 	 have strong potential, aptitude and passion in performing on handbells are creative and forthcoming in collaboration

PA TALENT AREAS	Your video recording should be:	Candidates will typically possess the following traits:
Modern Dance	 A one minute ballet solo that can be done safely within a 3mx3m space. This does not have to be in a studio setting. Recordings in group settings will not be considered unless the applicant is performing a solo of about onemin in an ensemble setting. Applicants may perform dance(s) learnt in school (e.g. CCA, previous dance examinations) or self-choreographed pieces and should be in suitable dance or PE attire. 	 have strong potential, aptitude and passion in dance are disciplined and committed to improving their dance skills
String Ensemble	 A two-to-four minute solo performance on your string instrument (either violin, viola, cello or double bass only). Applicants may perform pieces previously learnt (e.g. pieces learnt in music lessons, parts from a concert piece, music from previous examinations). 	 have strong potential, aptitude and passion in performing on the violin, viola, cello or double bass are creative and forthcoming in collaboration
